* On May 20, 1506, the Italian explorer Christopher Columbus died in Valladolid, Spain. CONTACT YOUR COUNTY AGENT FOR CONTROL MEASURES You Are Required to Destroy Noxious Weeds on Your Property

Notice is hereby given this 8th day of May, 2024, pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 2011, Section 18.78, to all owners, occupants, agents and public officials in charge of lands in Clearwater County, Minnesota, that noxious weeds on such lands shall be destroyed or eradicated by effective methods approved by your local weed inspector as often as may be required to prevent the weeds from blooming and maturing seeds or spreading by roots or other means. The county noxious weeds are: Bohemian Knotweed, Common Barberry, Oriental Bittersweet, Purple Loosestrife, Giant Knotweed, Leafy Spurge, Canada Thistle, Japanese Knotweed, Plumeless Thistle, Wild Parsnip, Common Tansy, Spotted Knapweed, Meadow Knapweed, Poison Hemlock, Narrow Leaf Bittercress, Non-Native Phragmites, Palmeri Amaranthus, Orange Hawkweed and Yellow Hawkweed.



I've spent half my life as a professional storyteller, conceptual artist, and art teacher. It was my sweet pleasure to share stories with the kindergarteners and first graders at Bagley Elementary School the week of April 22 - 26. The youth were awesome, kind, and active participants during the storytelling, and in the individual art making. I couldn't have imagined a better welcome - seriously - by the teachers and their classes. I LOVED every minute! The young people gave thoughtful answers to questions, were considerate of others, and expressed themselves through their art making in delightful ways. Every single child showed me they are a bright hope for the world's future. Bravo to their families and school.

Kindergartners in each class helped me draw Wild Thing Monsters. I do the drawing, but the kids tell me WHAT to draw. Each monster gets a name created by the first letter taken from several students' first name. The youth then made individual drawings of their own wild things. You will note in the photo, we have on newspapers hats. Those are hats of creativity - they help us imagine great ideas when we wear them. At the end of the day, kindergartners received a copy of my self-written and illustrated book, "No Bruce! No!"

First graders listened to stories and made art to help them recall the story later. They were a wise group. Let me tell you, they gave the most thoughtful answers after the stories about what actions help a person be kind and generous. They also did a challenging artwork requiring learning a new skill in a short time. Each first grader went home with a copy of my book, "Often Odd Poems to Read Out Loud with Lots of Drama".

Here is one of my children's poems from my "Often Odd Poems to Read..." book. Kids can act out the action of a plant growing up, out, then blooming. How might they act out the rain part?
