CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS JULY 10, 2024

The Bagley City Council met in regular session on July 10, 2024, at 5:30 p.m. in the City Council Chambers. Present: Mayor Sidney F. Michel, Councilmembers Dennis Merschman, Jon Brovold, Chad Bonik and John Sutherland, City Clerk Faye Jacobs and Deputy Clerk Priscilla Johnson. Also Present: Chris Arnold, Bill Masterson, Adam Gunderson, Darin Halverson, Allie Dalrymple and Karla Eufrazio (via zoom at 6:00 p.m.). Mayor Michel opened the meeting at 5:30 p.m. and asked that the agenda be amended, adding G.O. Bonding under unfinished business. Brovold made a motion to approve the agenda with the addition. Seconded by Sutherland, motion carried. Darin Halverson, Clearwater County Sheriff, addressed the board, stating he wanted to open a line of communication between the city and county and asked if there were any concerns the Council may have. Halverson spoke briefly about his department. Masterson explained an additional four days can be added to Liquidated Damages (LD's) to Reierson Construction for the Water/Wastewater Project at \$1,500 per day for a total of an additional \$6,000.00 to the \$65,920.00 that was approved at the June 26th meeting. Masterson stated that Karvacko (project engineer) was in agreement that the Liquidated Damages

should assessed as they occur so they are well documented, it will not affect the initial payment to Reierson Construction. Sutherland made a motion to add the additional \$6,000 of LD's to the previous LD's of \$65,920.00 for a new total in Liquidated Damages of \$71,920.00 that may be imposed on Reierson Construction. Seconded by Brovold, motion carried. A motion to approve the minutes of the June 3, 2024, June 12, 2024 and June 26, 2024 meetings as written was made by Merschman. Seconded by Bonik, motion carried. Sutherland made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda, which included, approval of checks written in June for the city and liquor store, approval to pay outstanding invoices for the city and liquor store, approval to pay ineligible expenses on Pay Application #9 for Phase #1 of the Water/Wastewater project in the amount of \$149,240.12 payable to Bagley Public Utilities, approval of Resolution #26-25 to adopt the new Base Pay Schedule, approval of Resolution #27-24 Pier Donation and approval of a Parade Permit for Homecoming. Seconded by Bonik, motion carried. City receipts and department expenditures for June were reviewed. Receipts for the month of June totaled \$487,851.24. Expenditures for all departments totaled \$333,833.41. The Budget and Profit & Loss reports for the Municipal Liquor Store were also reviewed. Department reports were heard. Chief Gunderson provided the

monthly calls for service report for the Police Department. Karla Eufrazio with ExakTime, a company that works with work time reporting and tracking for employees, joined the meeting via zoom and gave a presentation on how ExakTime reporting works. Masterson reported on Zoning, Roads & Bridges and Public Utilities. Liquor Store Manager Arnold provided bar graphs with gross sales and gross profits compared for 5 years. Arnold asked that his recent hire be moved up on the pay scale, as very little training was needed. Merschman made a motion to move Landan Sorensen up to the same pay scale step as Calab Waggoner. Seconded by Bonik, motion carried. Arnold provided a copy of the Beverage Dynamics article that featured the Bagley Liquor Store. Mayor Michel stated that a meeting may be scheduled with Todd Haugen with Ehlers Finance Advisors to discuss the General Obligation Bond for city projects. Being there was no further business to come before the board; motion to adjourn was made by Merschman. Seconded by Brovold, motion carried.

CITY COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS JULY 24, 2024

The Bagley City Council met on July 25, 2024 at 5:30 p.m. in the Bagley City Council Chambers. Present: Mayor Sidney F. Michel, Councilmembers Dennis Merschman, John Sutherland and Jon Brovold, City Clerk Faye Jacobs and Deputy Clerk Priscilla Johnson. Councilmember Chad Bonik was absent. Also Present: Bill Masterson, Mike Karvacko, Adam Gunderson, Vickly Fletcher, Chris Arnold and Todd Haugen (via zoom). Mike Karvacko was in audience to update the Council on the progress of the Water/Wastewater project. He reported that Phase 1 has reached substantial completion with the punch list going out to Reierson Construction on June 10th. Change order #3 was sent to Reierson on July 8th which included this spring's Liquidated Damages. There has been no response from Reierson. Karvacko reminded Council that the Liquidated Damages to date are 49 days from last fall and 15 days that were imposed this spring, totaling \$65,920.00 at this point. Retainage of \$273,000.00 has been withheld from payments to Reierson Construction. Stage 2 was completed in 23 working days, 3 days over contract. Karvacko asked how the Council wanted to proceed, it was the consensus of Council to proceed as before, imposing Liquidated Damages for the 3 days. Pay application #1 for Phases 2 and 3 is included in the Council packets in the amount of \$524,756.85 it will be approved

along with other items on the Consent agenda. Karvacko continued with his update that includes Reierson's proposed schedule for Phase 3, construction began on July 22nd however the proposed schedule had that phase starting July 17th. The project will not go beyond October 15th to avoid problems going into the winter season. The final phases for the Water/Wastewater Project are set to be completed in 2025. Karvacko reported that MNDOT Aeronautics has completed its review of requests for the State Fiscal Year 2025 funding grants. The Bagley Municipal Airport Plan Update was selected to receive a State Grant of \$75,000.00. Notice of a wish to proceed must be submitted to the State by August 31, 2024 and a complete grant request must be submitted by November 30, 2024. Sutherland made a motion to proceed with the funding process. Seconded by Brovold, motion carried with Sutherland and Brovold voting in favor, Merschman voting against. The grant money will be used for crack sealing of the runway. Todd Haugen, with Ehlers Public Finance Advisors, was on hand (via zoom) to answer questions on General Obligation Bonding. The city is planning to bond to cover the cost of the remodeling and addition to the fire hall that was damaged in 2023 and to cover expenses for the Water/Wastewater project that are ineligible for the USDA loan or the Bonding Grant. Mayor Michel asked that the agenda be amended, adding budgets to Unfinished Business. Sutherland made a motion to accept the agenda with the added

amendment. Seconded by Merschman, motion carried. Merschman made a motion to approve the Consent Agenda which included, approval of Resolutions #28-24 and #29-24 Calling for Public Hearings for G.O. Bonding for the Fire Department and Street Department, approval to pay an additional \$253.98 to VISA for an invoice not included in the July 10, 2024 meeting, approval requesting funds for Pay Application #1 for Phases 2 and 3 of the Water/Wastewater Project and approval of requested Draw #14 for Phase 1. Seconded by Sutherland, motion carried. Motion was made by Brovold to approve the Memorandum of Understanding between the City of Bagley and Law Enforcement Labor Services. Seconded by Sutherland, motion carried. Mayor Michel requested employee evaluations be completed in the next few weeks. Jacobs will start work on the 2024 proposed budget, which is due to the County by the end September. Masterson is working with the Bagley Day Activity Center (DAC) for either a vacation of a city owned right-of way or an encroachment permit that affects property owned by the DAC that they wish to sell. Being there was no further business to come before the board; motion to adjourn was made by Merschman. Seconded by Brovold, motion carried.
