Bagley City Council Minutes

The profit and loss and monthly budget report for the liquor store also were reviewed. Sutherland made a motion to approve the financials, seconded by Bonik, motion carried.

Squads are being setup with GPS so dispatch can know where the squads are at. He also presented the council with numbers on calls as primary per officer comparing the City and County. In 2024 overall there were 521 calls per officer for the City and 422 for the county per the breakdown presented. Gunderson asked if council members are interested in training simulator to be set up at the chambers for council members to be able to set up a night for them to go through the simulator.

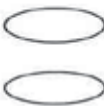

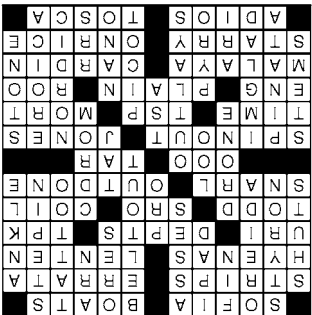
