Licenses, Resolution 22-25 State Agreement A1501-30 Clear Acquisition Plan for Airport, and approval to transfer \$11,995.00 from the Police Car committed fund to the general fund for the difference between insurance payment and purchase price of new vehicle paid for in November. Seconded by Sutherland, motion carried.

City receipts and budget reports were reviewed. City receipts for the month were \$21,811.63. City Expenditures for the month were \$124,924.96. The Municipal Liquor Store profit and loss and budget report for November was also gone over. Sutherland made a motion to approve the financials, seconded by Bonik, motion carried.

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Fire Chief Netland presented two bills to the council. The first is \$6,370.00 for turnout gear for the new hires. The second is for \$6,400.00 to replace the memorial cabinet with insurance money. The department is switching over to a new recording system and the best practice is to have an Ipad to make it mobile and able to enter the information at a fire. The department is receiving a \$20,000 donation from an anonymous donor to be used to honor a husband that passed away. An idea is to use it for a down payment to replace the Brush Rig which is 30+ years old and needs replacement and memorialize his name on it.

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Police Chief Gunderson provided the monthly stats. There were 40 calls for service in November. Interviews were conducted with two candidates. Gunderson requested approval to start the background check on both candidates. Sunderland made a motion to start background checks, seconded by Bonik, motion carried. New police vehicle is in and waiting on getting equipment installed to be ready to use. Gunderson requested Officer Olson be able to take his squad car home, he is working extra shifts being down an officer. Councilman Bonik suggested trying it on a trial basis for a month and see how it goes.

Bids came in for the Park Road Improvement project, Masterson and Karvakk suggest the City awards the Base Bid to RJ Zavoral and Sons with the City responsibility being \$41,030. Bonik made the following motion, Contingent on Clearwater County concurrence; to award the bid for SAP 015-600-013: City of Bagley Park Road Improvement Project to R.J. Zavoral & Sons, Inc. of East Grand Forks, Minnesota in the amount of \$124,863.00 for the Base Bid. Seconded by Bonik, motion carried.

Bonik made a motion to approve Resolution 23-25 Amending the Boundaries of Tax Increment Financing District 2-1, seconded by Sunderland, motion carried.

Bonik made a motion to approve Resolution 24-25 Approving the Decertification of Tax Increment financing District No. 2-2 of the City of Bagley. Seconded by Sutherland, motion carried.
